Why is it important to know who Jesus is?

John Stott: "Christianity is Christ. The person and work of Christ are the rock upon which the Christian religion is built. If He is not who He said he was, and if He did not do what He said he came to do, the foundation is undermined and the whole superstructure will collapse. Take Christ from Christianity, and you disembowel it; there is practically nothing left. Christ is the center of Christianity; all else is circumference."

A. HIS INDIRECT CLAIMS OF WHO HE WAS: Jesus claimed to be the answer to the needs of people

B. HIS CLAIMS OF AUTHORITY: Jesus claimed to have the authority to do things only God could do

- 1. Forgive sins. Mark 2:1-12; Luke 7:36-50
- 2. Give life. John 5:21; 17:1-2
- 3. Judge the world. John 5:22,25-29
- **C. HIS DIRECT CLAIMS OF WHO HE WAS:** Jesus believed Himself to be not only the Messiah predicted in the Old Testament (John 4:25-26), but God Himself.
- 1. He Equated One's Response to Him With Their Response to God. In John's Gospel we hear him say that to know him was to know God (John 8:19; 14:7); to see him was to see God (14:9); to believe in him was to believe in God (12:45); to hate Him was to hate God (15:23); to fail to honor him was to fail honor God (5:23).
- 2. He Claimed to be the "I Am"/Jehovah/Yahweh/God Himself. John 8:51- 59; Exodus 3:13-14; John 18:5-6
- 3. He Claimed to be God. John 10:30-33; 5:17-18

Take Away:

A. IF HIS CLAIMS ARE FALSE: HE IS NOT GOD

Options if Jesus' claims are false:

- 1. He thought he was God, but was mistaken: Jesus was a lunatic.
- 2. He knew he was not God, but he lied: Jesus was a liar.

B. IF HIS CLAIMS ARE TRUE: HE IS GOD

Because He is God, He had every right and obligation to claim to be so: **Jesus is Lord**

The historical Jesus' actions are congruent with His integrity. Meaning no disrespect to the religious convictions of others, I still can't help wondering how we can explain away what to me is the greatest miracle of all and which is recorded in history. No one denies there was such a man, that he lived and that he was put to death by crucifixion. Where...is the miracle I spoke of? Well consider this and let your imagination translate the story into our own time -possibly to your own home town. A young man whose father is a carpenter grows up working in his father's shop. One day he puts down his tools and walks out of his father's shop. He starts preaching on street corners and in the nearby countryside, walking from place to place, preaching all the while, even though he is not an ordained minister. He does this for three years. Then he is arrested, tried and convicted. There is no court of appeal, so he is executed at age 33 along with two common thieves. Those in charge of his execution roll dice to see who gets his clothing -- the only possessions he has. His family cannot afford a burial place for him so he is interred in a borrowed tomb. End of story?
